



his year we have added several new drivers and lost a few. We have added several new patients and lost a few. We are all getting older. We accept children up to 18 years of age, and existing patients may be cared for a little longer under special circumstances. We have transported several kids that were only a few weeks old, and some have been transported all their lives.

During the 2024 MASA convention at Virginia Beach, Noble Raymond Schmidt was elected 1st Vice-president of the MASA Shepherds/ Roadrunner group. Good luck, Ray.

Noble Dave Richards is a member of Washington Lodge #164 and Chairman of the Blue Knights Motorcycle Club. He presented a check for \$1,000.00 to Syria Shrine Transportation Fund. This was part of the proceeds from the 21st Annual Blue Ride held earlier this year.

We have several patients that meet us at the garage for the Philadelphia trips. They appreciate our heated bathroom after that long trip. The drivers all love this garage, but there are some Shriners that don't like it, don't know that it is paid for, and that it doesn't cost Syria Shrine anything.

The garage is paid off. Not from the Transportation Fund, not from the Syria

general checking account, and not from the Syria Investments. It did not cost Syria Shrine anything but a loan for several months.

I would like to review the history of the garage, but first review Roadrunner history. When Syria Shrine was relocated from the old Syria Mosque in Oakland to our new building, the only basement in this building is in the rear quarter of the building. We had a 2-car tandem garage for one van. Over the years with patient demand, we now have 3 vans, and the garage is used for tractors, mowers, and snow removal equipment. The vans were moved to the parking lot and the pavilion in the winter. Drivers have been asking about a garage ever since we were moved to the parking lot.

In 2019 III. Sir William Weiss gave us permission to open a Garage Building Fund. By the end of the year we had several thousands of dollars in the fund. In 2020 III. Sir Donald Taylor gave permission to get bids for the garage (the covid year). It was the Potentate's project, and all his funds were added to the Garage Building Fund. It was fall before we could get any bids. The 3rd and lowest bid came in late December after the December board meeting for a metal building. The contract was signed to lock in the amount.

At the January 1st Quarterly Zoom Meeting in 2021, III Sir Donald Green tabled the project until the next Quarterly meeting. There were too many questions and not enough answers for the project.

At April's Quarterly Meeting the garage project was proposed, voted on by the members present, and overwhelmingly passed. Then the metal building could not be delivered. It was back logged for over a year, and the design had to be changed. A stone and red metal roof to match the main building was the new design. Five anonymous Noble's donated thousands to pay for the added charge. In 2022 III Sir Terry Steinheiser helped getting the funds for the Garage Building Fund. By spring the garage was completed, and the bill was paid. We did not borrow from a bank to make up the difference, but we did borrow from the Shrine to pay off the contract.

By the end of December

2022, thanks to Washington Caravan No. 2 and Butler Caravan No. 14 who made large donations, plus many others, the building fund had enough to pay back the loan to Syria Shrine.

Thanks to all the individuals, Nobles, churches, Blue Lodges, Units, Clubs, Caravans and memorials for the donations to build our garage.

The garage has been paid off since 2022, and it did not cost Syria Shrine anything but a loan for several months. Also, Syria receives



rent, to cover additional taxes, insurance, and utilities. These funds come from Roadrunner parade donations and the Transportation Fund.

The drivers and patients are delighted the van wraps are not fading out anymore and that the vans are kept clean and out of the elements.

We are lucky in this Temple to have all the support needed to complete our mission to take care of the kids.

We drive so kids can walk!





Happy 120th Birthday!

Music has always played a prominent part in the Shrine. After 120 years our Pittsburgh Syria Shrine Band continues to carry on important musical traditions.

he Band had its start in 1902 when four volunteers, responding to a call by then Potentate William H. Walker, organized a brass band. It received its charter as a unit in December, 1904. Throughout the following years, several professional musicians were recruited. Band leader Charles Easton helped to grow the Band, and directed it in many concerts and Imperial Sessions. Since the Shrine Band was comprised of Shrine

members exclusively, it was designated as the first Shrine Band in North America in 1907!

When Noble Gaston retired in 1916, Noble Arbogast became the director of the Band. He led the Band in a dedication concert of the Syria Mosque in 1916. Following his leadership, the Band was fortunate to have many talented directors over the years: Noble George Matz, Noble Fred Smith, Noble John Stephens, and Noble Robert Timmons. During Timmons' 10-year tenure, the Band played many concerts, parades, and entered band competitions. In 1993, Noble Dean Streator was elected director of the Syria Band and served for approximately twenty years, all the while improving the musicianship of the Band.

The Shrine Band is currently led by Noble Jack R. Anderson who became the director in 2015. He directed the Band when it performed several years at MASA in Virginia Beach, VA and received several first-place awards. With the addition of wives and friends of band members playing, the Shrine Band currently has a membership of almost 30 people.

The Syria Shrine Band concluded its 2024 season at the Prelude to Christmas Concert at the Shrine Center in November. It is on a winter break until practices resume in early March. After 120 years, the Pittsburgh Syria Shrine Band carries on rich traditions and continues to entertain at concerts and parades in the Pittsburgh area.






